


MG Beats Twin Cam Maseratis! Compiled by Dan Shockey

Overshadowed by the great MG class and team win at the 1933 Mille Miglia was the race win by a

private entry of an MG K3 in Italy. I couldn't find a lot of information about the 1933 race - but the 1934 race which was won by Italians has a lot of information published. This was a very significant race against the best of Europe (think F1) in the very heart of Italian

racing dominance. The further win in 1933 at the Alpine Rally with MG L2 sports cars cemented MG's reputation on the Continent. (See *The Octagon*, Feb., 2024.)





One of the early customers for a K3 was Whitney Straight, an American who had attended Cambridge University. He was bitten by the racing bug, and being financially able to indulge his passion, he ordered a K3 in chassis form. To this he had a boat-tailed lightweight shell body fitted. Straight had entered the car for the Mannin Beg, but it was not ready for him, and his first real race was to be in Italy, the Coppa Acerbo, held as part of a week-long speed festival on the Adriatic Coast held in memory of a local First World War hero, Capitano Tito Acerbo.

Few knew Straight was going, even those at Abingdon, but when it was reported that he had won the Junior race, beating all the Maseratis at record speed the result so surprised the Italians that one of the Maserati supporters called for engine measurement! Naturally the engine was within capacity limits, which impressed the Italians considerably, especially the great Tazio Nuvolari, who was to race in the GP which formed the major event of the week. Kimber was well pleased, and a new star was made.



"The checkered flag fell for him as he coasted on to his depot, and the only sound which broke the quiet was the humming of his tyres and the dry hissing of his brake-shoes in their drums. The crowd was completely silent, hardly realising that the Magnette had won.

"The only applause was that from the mechanics in Straight's pit. The crowd could not believe that the green machine had beaten the Maseratis. A glass of champagne had been pressed into Straight's hand and he was drinking it before Barbierri crossed the line—and by that time the crowd had found its voice.

"Their enthusiasm was extraordinary, and long before the remaining machines came in, officials were struggling to prevent the crowd dashing across the road to obtain a closer view of the M.G."

Hand-Made Paper Cars

Need an indoor project? Abingdon Rough Rider member (and former GM exec) Bob Lutz has made the following small-scale models entirely of paper. (Few exemptions are as noted.)

Bob Lutz has completed the K3. Here's his write-up on it:

Finished, at last. Only non-paper parts are steering wheel rim (as usual), wire mesh on grille and thin drain tubes on radiator and fuel filler. The bottle cap is for visual scale. I am reasonably pleased with this one, although, as usual, I know where my mistakes are.



Bob added further info: "the wire wheels are silver spokes painted onto a clear plastic shallow cone. The only metal part is always the steering wheel rim, which is plastic-coated soft wire. The wire mesh in the grilles is metal as well. On the K3 Magnette, the tiny drain tubes on the radiator and fuel fillers are thin steel wire, as well. But...99 44/100s pure otherwise!"

Just finished it in Grand Prix form. Only non-paper parts are wire mesh in the radiator, steering wheel rim and thin steel wire for the brake linkage. Overall length is about 7 inches.





Classic Car Emissions The same as drinking three coffees a day!

Britain's classic car fleet accounts for just 0.22 per cent of the UK's transport emissions and driving a classic is no more impactful on the environment than drinking three cups of coffee a day.

That is the claim of a new report that attempts to capture the carbon footprint of the nation's classic car fleet.

The authors add that a return flight (one person's share) from London to New York, or someone's typical three-day Christmas celebrations, emit slightly more CO₂ than a year of driving a classic.

Produced by automotive communications agency, Loop, *Quantifying Classic Car Emissions 2022* used DVLA data to define what constitutes a classic car and estimate the size of the UK fleet. Cars built before 1992 were included, in line with guidelines laid down by FIVA, (Federation Internationale des Vehicles Anciens) which represents historic vehicle owners throughout Europe. A total of 874,000 classic cars (both registered for the road and declared as SORN) are recorded by the DVLA.

The Federation of British Historic Vehicle Clubs puts the <u>annual distance typically notched up</u> by a classic at 1200 miles, versus 7200 miles for most new cars.

Calculating the average emissions of the typical classic had to be estimated, given many vehicles were manufactured prior to formalised standards. By examining data from the past 70 years, and factoring in fuel consumption and average annual mileage, the <u>report claims</u> that the average CO_2 emissions of a classic car is 641kg a year.

"Assigning a figure to the carbon footprint of the UK's classic cars has long been a challenge," said Alex Kefford, the report's author. "By taking a data-first approach that included developing our own software... we've been able to shed some light on this particularly tricky topic."


Kefford said the survey also showed that the <u>MGB</u> is the most popular classic car with Britain's drivers, that there are more classic <u>Ford Escorts</u> and <u>Volkswagen Golfs</u> declared as SORN as there

are registered on our roads, and that average passenger car fuel economy has doubled since 1956.

The survey follows a previous study, by the Historic and Classic Vehicles Alliance, which estimated the typical classic car's emissions to be half that of a mobile phone or desktop computer.




