

# **Exhausting Expense**

Let's talk inflation. *(Oh, please, can we???)* Of all the sources of inflation, services have gone up much more than hard goods. Unfortunately, most of us need services more frequently that we need to say buy a new stove. One of the services that has inflated the most in the last year is auto repair. An amazing 20% increase in the last year alone! Sort of eats up the much smaller raise we got last year.

There are many reasons that running an auto repair business has had to increase prices in the last year. (**Bet you can agree on seeing another bump next year too.**) Everybody that works in the shop pays more for what they need, so the employees want a raise and that along with all other costs (Insurance, taxes, regulatory fees, disposal fee, parts cost, healthcare ...etc, etc, etc) as expected, get passed on to us. (*This is what economist call a wage price spiral*) To be a *viable* business *margins must be maintained*. Therefore, pricing becomes infinitely adjustable, but usually it seems only goes up.

Yours truly was remined of this when I took CJs Mazda to my local shop to have it inspected. In PA this is an annual thing for smog, but in PA we also check the cars overall condition. *(Which is a good thing)* As usual, the car passed both inspections with no issues. The inspector did note that the brakes were probably going to fail next time. They also told me that the rotors were fine now, and that brake wear would eventually ruin these too. *(Thanks, I know this, but other may not so good to say it Mr. Mechanic!)* 

So how much would a brake job, without rotors, cost? *(\$ 405.98)* Just for new pads front and rear? They also informed me that they would do a fuel system cleaning and replace all 4 spark plugs for only an additional \$382.94. They would also do a brake fluids exchange for \$90.98. All total when including shop supplies of \$35 *(coffee and donuts aren't cheap)* and \$54.90 paid to the Commonwealth, we come up with a complete bill of \$969.80. Labor was \$543.92 of the total. **Mon Deux!** *(rj is studying French again.)* 

As I looked at the estimate I pondered a few things. This is a well maintained 2013 Mazda CX5 that looks like it came out if the showroom. No body dings, all electronics working, great gas milage; so, I figured the investment could be justified. But did I need everything? I think I can replace fours spark plugs for less than \$179.99. It's the brakes and possible inspection failure next year that had me really thinking??? I have not worked on many modern cars lately, but with the help of YouTube there's not much I won't try. (Videos on home surgery should be avoided)

My next investigation of course led me to trek down the Amazon to get parts for the brake job. I put premium front and rear pads in my Amazon canoe and even threw in a handy tool for compressing disc brake calipers. Gee, \$80 bucks sounds like a good deal versus the shop. The replacement of the pads was a **very** simple task. **Hint**, watch more than one YouTube video. Different guys show different tricks than make your life easier.

Now, this Exhaust Note is not just to bitch about inflation and the high cost of auto repair. It's designed to be motivational. When's the last time you inspected the brakes on your LBC? A car that won't run is a problem; a car that won't stop can be really bad. When everyone's friend, Mr. Heaps, hosts the annual MGOB Spring car clinic one of the most frequent problems found is leaking rear wheel cylinders, which leads to of course worthless rear brake shoes. We also find front rotors that are warped and pads that are a shadow of what they once were. We who own on LBCs know that finding a competent shop to work on them is increasingly hard. We need to be more self-sufficient.

It's winter - you have time to do this. I know last month I gave you a whole bunch of things to occupy the darker days, but this job needs to be done, and I have confidence you can do it. If you need help, there's YouTube. May I recommend the great guru <a href="Mr. Twist">Mr. Twist</a> to help you. Now, you may also need supervisors to assist you, so have a few cold ones handy and of course a luncheon should always be provided.

Of course, **no good deed goes unpunished**. I got to bask in the accomplishment of expertly doing the brakes on CJ's Mazda for only two months. She, of course, then traded it for the new shinny thing now in our garage. I should have gone fishing!

OK, you've made it through January. Only 2 more months till the earth tilts in our favor. Have you cleaned your garage yet? Is the trickle charger on your LBC? Just saying don't waste these cold days; your couch, like your LBC, could use a brake too. Exhausted now, so go listen to the tune I embedded in the title.
